Fred says ...

Fred's toybox





How can I help my child to practise their handwriting?

Remind your child:

- To hold their pencil in 'perfect pencil grip'
- Say the handwriting phrase to help them form the letter correctly
- Say the sound and ask your child to write it





How can I help my child to practise their handwriting?

 Support and encourage your child to start letters at the correct position

How will I know how well my child is doing?

After the first half term your child will work with children who are at the same reading level as them. Children will move to a different group if they are making progress. Your child will have one-to-one support if we think he or she needs some extra help.

We will keep you updated at parent's evenings or arrange to speak to you if we need to.





Glossary

'Special friends' a combination of two or three letters representing one sound, e.g. ck, ay, igh, ee

'Fred Talk' Fred the frog helps children to read and spell. He can say the sounds in words but he can't say the whole word, so the children have to help him.







Glossary

'Perfect pencil grip' wherever possible children sit at a table to write. They hold a pencil using the tripod grip with the non-writing hand flat holding their paper.

'Fred in your head' once children can sound out a word, we teach them to say the sounds silently in their heads.





Glossary


'Red Words' red words are also known as common exception or tricky words. They occur in stories regularly (said, what, where) but have unusual letter combinations ('ai' in the makes the sound 'e'). Remind your child not to use Fred Talk to read Red Words but instead to 'stop and think.' Tell them the word if you need to.
